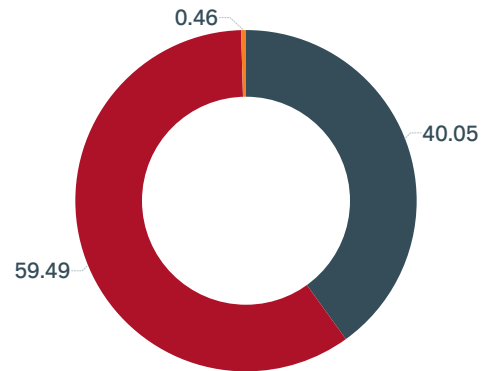

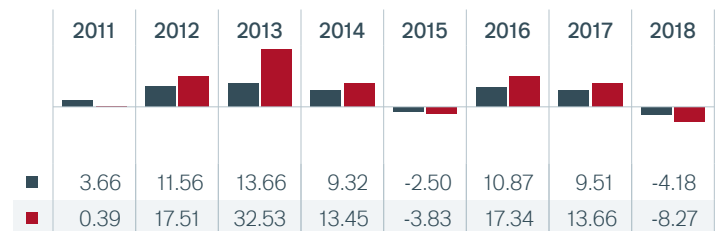
## Asset Allocation (%)

index. Positive alpha means outperformance on a risk-adjusted basis. **Beta** measures the volatility of a security or portfolio relative to an index. Less than one means lower volatility than the index; more than one means greater volatility. **R-squared (R<sup>2</sup>)** measures the relationship between portfolio and index performance on a scale of 0.00 (0%) to 1.00 (100%). A higher R<sup>2</sup> indicates more of the portfolio's performance is affected by market movements and vice versa. **Standard Deviation** measures historical volatility. Higher standard deviation implies greater volatility. **Sharpe Ratio** measures risk-adjusted performance using excess returns versus the "risk-free" rate and the volatility of those returns. A higher ratio means better return per unit of risk. **Duration** measures a bond price's sensitivity to changes in interest rates. The longer a bond's duration, the higher its sensitivity to changes in interest rates and vice versa.
